Between 01-29 days before your arrival date 100% of the total tour price will be charged as a cancellation fee.



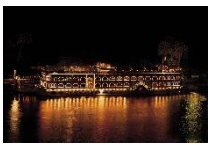

Giza Pyramids Complex - The greatest archaeological wonder on the face of the earth the Giza Plateau was created by the immortal kings of the 4th dynasty between 2600 BC and 2500 BC to lead a golden path to the heavens



The Great Pyramid - The legendary legacy of King Khufu was immortalized within the golden core of the Great Pyramid that dates back to 2570 BC which was built in only 15 years using ramps and 400,000 workers under the command of Hemiunu the main architect became 146.6 meters (481 feet) and weigh a total of six million tons. Within the great pyramid are the divine Queen's Chamber and King's Chamber that showcases the brilliance and mastery of the ancient Egyptian builders.



The Great Sphinx - The oldest monumental sculpture in history and the most famous statue on the face of the earth was created during the rule of Pharaoh Khafre (2558–2532 BC). The design of the Great Sphinx has based on the impressive design of the mythical sphinx which displayed the face of Khafre. The statue is the source of great speculations about its origin and age as it attracted many theories of pseudohistory and pseudoarchaeology.



The Valley Temple - The heavenly valley temple of Chephren is composed of 16 massive limestone pillars which are covered with polished red-pink granite that acted as the centre of the reception, Mummification, and purification of the royal bodies of the 4th dynasty.

The Egyptian Museum - The Epic Egyptian Museum was created to offer a magical road that displays the brilliance and glamour of the ancient Egyptian Civilization that dates back to more than 5000 years.



Mohamed Ali Mosque - It was constructed between 1830 and 1848, the mosque was named "The Alabaster Mosque" because most of its walls were made out of pure alabaster. The mosque is a replica of the Blue Mosque in Istanbul.



Coptic Cairo - Coptic Cairo is a historic district in Egypt, renowned for its rich cultural and religious significance. Located in Old Cairo, it is home to some of the oldest Christian churches in the country, including the Coptic Orthodox Church of St. Sergius and Bacchus. These architectural treasures showcase intricate Coptic art and offer glimpses into Egypt's early Christian history. The area also houses the Coptic Museum, a repository of artifacts, manuscripts, and textiles preserving the heritage of the Coptic community. Beyond its religious importance, Coptic Cairo's narrow streets and vibrant markets provide a charming backdrop for exploring the cultural tapestry of this ancient district.



Khan El Khalili – Khan El Khalili, one of Cairo's oldest and most famous souks, is a bustling marketplace steeped in history and culture. Lose yourself in the labyrinthine alleys filled with shops selling everything from spices and textiles to jewellery and souvenirs. Experience the vibrant atmosphere, bargaining with friendly merchants, and savouring traditional Egyptian street food amidst the charming chaos of this iconic bazaar.

Catacombs of Kom El Shoqafa - The highly rare Catacombs of Kom El Shoqafa is a Roman burial ground that became one of the seven wonders of the Middle Ages to house the remains of an ancient family tomb that dates back to the 2nd century AD. It gained overwhelming fame due to its mixture of Egyptian and Roman artistic design and architecture.



Pompey's Pillar - The glorious Pillar of Pompey dates all the way to 302 AD and is known to be the only one of its kind in Egypt. It is an 82-foot (25-meter) granite column made to honor Emperor Diocletian plus it may hold the remains of General Pompey.



Qaitbay Citadel - The blessed citadel of Qaitbey is a majestic fortress constructed in 1477 AD by Sultan Al-Ashraf Qa'it Bay on the coast of the Mediterranean Sea in the same glorious location that once held the great lighthouse of Alexandria. The great citadel is able to display the most incredible collection of Islamic designs and artifacts.



Alexandria Library - Bibliotheca of Alexandria is able to reflect the cultural and historical wealth of the immortal city of Alexandria which was inaugurated in 2002 and filled to showcase a wide collection of the most majestic of books, artifacts, and rare artifacts across the vast history of Egypt from all ages.



El Alamein - Approximately 110 Km away from Alexandria. Proceed to World War II remains and cemeteries,(WW II Cemetery). El Alamein Battle was one of the most significant confrontations of this War. Your first stop during the shore excursion from

Alexandria will be at the Military Museum including displays of weapons, military garb, and tanks. Descriptions of the actions of Montgomery, Rommel, and the others who participated in the battle are also on display. Visit the WW II Cemeteries, located on the west of the town, on a small peninsula overlooking the sea. The citadel-like cemeteries are the final resting place for Commonwealth, Greek, Italian and German soldiers.



Morsi Abu Abbas Mosque - This incredible mosque of Abu al-Abbas al-Mursi was built in 1307 AD to offer an insight into the most captivating example of Islamic architectural design and decoration which served as the inspiration for the Sheikh Zayed Mosque in Abu Dhabi.
